Overview:

The Australian Peacekeeper & Peacemaker Veterans' Association (APPVA) was established at the Pine Rivers RSL Sub-Branch, Kallangur, QLD on the 24th October 1997. There were five inaugural members in attendance. This has now grown to almost 1,300 members across Australia and some members who reside overseas (as at Oct 2011). The Constituency of the APPVA is around 69,000 Peacekeepers, 19,000 Iraq and 18,000 Afghanistan veterans. In addition to these figures, is Peacetime Service, which includes those who served in the ADF who did not deploy, but served Australia Post 1975 onwards. The APPVA recognises, fosters and supports the servicemen and women who have contributed, directly or indirectly, to Australia's significant and ongoing contribution to Peacekeeping and Peacemaking Operations since 14th September 1947 to the present day.

Background. Australia's peacekeeping involvement commenced in Indonesia on 14 September 1947 with four Australian Military officers, being the world's first peacekeepers, deploying to the United Nations Good Offices Commission in Dutch East Indies (Indonesia). Since that first UN deployment, Australia has contributed over 75,000 personnel to more than 73 Operations in 64 different countries, **non-stop for over 60 years** up to present day Operations in the Middle East Area of Operations (MEAO), Africa, Timor Leste, and The Solomon Islands amongst others.

APPVA constituents include those who served in warlike (peacemaking) operations and / or non-warlike operations such as Peacekeeping, United Nations Contingents, Military Observers, Truce Supervision, Emergency Forces, Special Commissions, Humanitarian Aid, Monitoring Forces, De-mining Teams and Training Teams – and any other Australian Defence Force (ADF), New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF), or Australian Federal (AFP) & State Police Operations, including Peacetime Service.

What we do for Veterans. The APPVA has a network of high quality and accredited Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Advocates and Practitioners, who specialise in multiple eligibility of three Compensation Acts, two Military Superannuation Acts, and also assistance to Police Overseas Veterans. The APPVA assists current and ex-serving ADF members with a range of matters from welfare to medals. The APPVA also assists the interests of our member's families. Representatives of the APPVA hold Federal Ministerial Appointments to a range of National Department of Veterans' Affairs, Centre of Military and Veteran Health, and at times Defence Force Forums. These Representatives put our member's interests to the

highest levels of Government. Additionally, the APPVA also provides representation at Senate Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Hearings, or Legislative Bills to prevent the erosion of entitlements. We also work with other like-minded Ex-Service Organisations to promote a collaborated approach to the Government in Veteran or Military Entitlements.

Not only Peacekeepers. In addition to supporting Peacekeepers and Peacemakers (Warlike Service), the APPVA also supports those who have served Post 1975 in the ADF in Peacetime; those ADF members who have deployed to the Middle East Area of Operations (MEAO) 2001 to the present; and Police overseas veterans.

Remembering our Mates and Fallen. The APPVA strives to remember the service, courage and sacrifice of those who have served on a large range of Operations since 1947 to the present and future. The remembrance of the respective overseas service has so far seen 73 ADF and Police personnel die on these operations. (These numbers are not inclusive of the Korean War, Borneo, Malaya or South Viet Nam). We remember our mates and the fallen by commemorating ANZAC Day; The International Day of UN Peacekeepers (29 May); Australian Peacekeeper's Day (14 September); and at times United Nations Day (24 October) annually.

The APPVA instigated and is closely aligned with the Australian Peacekeeping Memorial Project Committee. This Project will see the construction of the National Peacekeeping Memorial on ANZAC Parade in Canberra, alongside those who have served before us. We need support to this Project.
